This week third and fourth grade students will be going on a field trip to the Planetarium on Friday. We will be leaving at 10:45 am and returning at 1:00 pm. Students will need to bring their lunch. Please no soda. Report cards for second quarter will also be available online starting Tuesday.

What we are learning-

Religion- This week we will be discussing what sins we should confess and to whom, who receives absolution, what the Pastoral Office is, and what Liturgical worship is.

Math- This week in math we will have a test on Monday. We will then focus on multiplication facts 0s, 1s, 10s, arrays, and perimeter.

Literacy- During writing, we will begin genre studies. We will be discussing and learning how to write different types of friendly letters, poems, folk tales, fairy tales, myths, tall tales, autobiographies, and biographies. During reading, we will be focusing on text structure.
